Please remember that this is a wellness schedule and, if your pet ever becomes ill, additional tests and diagnostics will be necessary.

75-85% of pets over the ages of 3 have dental disease! Dogs and cats are not supposed to have bad breath. They have bad breath because they do not brush their teeth. Brushing your pet's teeth is beneficial for both your pet and your pocketbook. Advanced dental disease can be costly, not to mention painful to your pet. If you are unable to brush your pet's teeth daily, consider having a dental cleaning performed on your pet on a regular basis

“Senior at Seven”

Pets don't age the way people do—they age much faster. Most pets are considered seniors at seven years of age. Be sure to visit your veterinarian regularly.
